

## PROF. P.L. SHALO

Prof. P.L. Shalo joined Egerton in 1968 and has grown through the ranks and is now a full Professor. He was trained in Agriculture at the Makerere University College, the University of East Africa, Post graduate work in Dairy Science and Technology at the Massey University in New Zealand, University of Reading MSc and Ph.D training in U.K. He holds a Ph.D degree in Food Science and Biotechnology. He spent part of the year 1986 in the U.S.A. as a Full Bright Scholar at the Universities of Wisconsin and Illinois.



He has been elected a Fellow of the Institute of Food Science and Technology in U.K., a member of the Institute of Food Technologists of the USA, a chartered Biologist of U.K. and a member of the Institute of Food Science and Technology (Kenya).

He is a past member of the FAO Experts Committee on Dairy Education and in this capacity designed the Dairy Technology Curriculum for Tengeru Institute in Tanzania, dairy Institute of Gabarone in Botswana and has had an input in the Dairy Development agenda for many countries of the continent in East, Southern and West Africa.

His current research areas include Food Processing and Preservation, Production and Utilization of Camel milk and now Safe Food Safe Dairy Project, that is working on mycotoxins in Cereals and milk and their implications to human health in Kenya.
